Innisfil Beach Road Finished

A project that has been over 7 years in the making, the final phase of Alcona's Innisfil Beach Road construction is set for completion this fall. The road has been redesigned with an urban feel that features new planters, medians, and benches along the length between 20th Sideroad and Lake Simcoe. The Town's new Urban Design Guidelines, Zoning By-law, Streetscaping and the Primary Settlement Area designation support the vision of making Alcona our urban core.
